The Associated Press stated that the "Thumbs-up for Lane" campaign was started as a way to encourage the boy and his family. It spread worldwide on social media. According to a family member, "Lane believed that the awareness this movement brought for childhood cancers would lead to a cure. Lane's legacy will live on as we move forward with this commitment we made to him to find a cure." Lane drew 366,000 Fans to his Facebook page. But what really peeked my interest about Lane was in a number of articles it mentions his Christian faith and his beautiful smile. Ernie Brown, Lane's favorite celebrity, after meeting him a few weeks ago, said, "People really looked up to him. He sure made his

On October 17, 2012 at 7:53 pm his mom said, "Our sweet Lane gained his Angel wings. Our hearts are broken but God has performed a World Wide Miracle through Lane over the past few weeks."

Lane sure didn't. His goal by being a "social media sensation" was to find a cure for childhood cancer.
